5. An area of 1.5 x 2.5 meters will be provided for each cluster participant.		





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6. 50% ornamental and 50% vegetable plants shall be combined to beautify the specified area.
7. For back support of the landscape installation, old tires for motorcycle shall be used to ensure the longevity and uniformity of output.
8. No questions shall be entertained during the contest proper except clarification and points of order.
9. The contest event shall be done on November 15 and shall be judged on November 18, 2023.
9. The output of the contest shall be donated to the host school.
